What is a QSP?

- QSP stands for Qualified Service Provider.
- QSPs are individuals or agencies.
- QSPs have met certain competency standards required to provide services to eligible clients.
- QSPs serve clients through the Department of Health and Human Services.
- QSPs are self-employed, unless you work for an agency.
 - This means you are responsible for tracking all of the work you do. This would include tasks such as completing monthly billing, filing taxes, and using an electronic verification program.
- A QSP will work in a variety of settings providing support in various ways.

What types of roles do QSPs perform?

QSPs can carry out a variety of different services and roles:

- Companionship
- Personal care
- Family personal care
- Homemaker
- Respite care
- Non-medical transportation (escort)
- Non-medical transportation (driver with vehicle)
- Supervision
- Adult day care
- Extended personal care
- Respite home care
- Attendant care
- Respite Adult Foster Care
- Case management
- Nurse education
- Chores
- Nurse management
